





Club Meeting Notes – The Annual Banquet



1. Thank You from The Prez – The Prez thanked Bob Yapp for collecting prizes. He thanked the board members for their hard work. He thanked the Edgartown Shellfish Department for the yummy oysters and clams, and thanked Ralph for digging up all the clams. The Prez thanked Dave and Victor for their continued work on our club website. The Prez thanked Dave Balon for overseeing the inputting members' In-house Derby and Ron



Domurat for compiling the club members' In-house and Derby statistics. The Prez thanked Lisa for her work with the newsletter and Steve for mailing out the hard copies of the newsletter. The Prez thanked Jim Cornwall for picking up the club pizzas for our meetings and Chris Edwards for coordinating the speakers for our club meetings.

- 2. Phil Horton gave the Treasurer's report. "It was a very good year," said Phil. We had a total income of \$26,682. We spent a total of \$9,231. We donated a total of \$11,500. We have \$5,000 in the operating account. We awarded \$12,000 in scholarships and currently have \$19,000 in the scholarship account. All the proceeds from the used tackle sale go directly into the scholarship fund. "We will be able to provide some very nice scholarships to a few graduating seniors in June," said Phil.
- 3. Matt Bass from the DEP (Environmental Protection) spoke to us about the new and current saltwater fishing regulations. Matt said that fluke and scup both took a hit last year and are down in population. The legal limit for fluke will probably be 17_{1/2} inches. Sea Bass will remain at 16^{1/2} inches. We are limited to three bluefish daily. Keeper stripers must measure between 28 inches to 31 inches. See chart on next page for all fishing limits.
- 4. Andy Kelly, the Director of Edgartown's Parks and Recreation Department, gave us a welcome update on Norton Point. Andy thanked everyone for the support MVSA members gave to him and his team in their first year of managing Norton Point. Andy said he hopes to open the beach in April and would love to see everyone out there taking rides on the beach. Pre-sales for beach stickers should open in April. Last year Norton beach passes brought in \$270,000, which pays for staff and beach nourishment. Andy talked about the winter storms and the pummeling the beaches took. He noted they are working on Atlantic Drive and South Beach, but it is going to take time, and about 1.5 million dollars. Andy is looking for Rangers, if anyone wants to apply. https://rb.gy/qyzr6z
- Andy's parting words: When Norton opens: DRIVE THE BEACH!



6. John Piekos gave us a brief update from MVBAG. John noted that MVBAG is thrilled with Andy and what is happening on Norton Point. John reminded us that TTOR has filed two NOIs. That TTOR needs an Order of Conditions – permission to drive through wetlands. John mentioned a new NOI submitted by a private landowner. John stressed to all members that we must use our voices and write to the Edgartown Conservation Commission and attend the Zoom meetings!

- 7. The Prez announced we are going to have another pig roast on the beach over Father's Day Weekend. More information to come. Day will depend on weather, hoping for Saturday.
- 8. The annual club shark tournament will be in July or August when the sharks arrive. Stay tuned.
- 9. Phil Horton sent out an update after the banquet. Money. The raffle brought in \$2715. Members paid \$2,040 in dues, both before and at the banquet. Dues is expected to trickle in via snail mail as the season goes on. The silent auction brought in \$1,675. The 50/50 raffle earned \$375 for the club. We sold \$70 in merchandise, and members donated \$370. In total, the banquet raised \$7,245.
- 10. We had donation buckets at the banquet for members to give to MVBAG. If you'd like to give now, you can scan this QR code.

Open Season: Jan 1 - Feb 28 ; Apr 1 - Dec 31 Year Round Minimum Size: 17" 18" Possession Limit: 20 fish No Limit

SCUP



Open Season: May 1 - December 31

Minimum Size: 9.5" from shore; 10.5" from vessel.

Possession Limit: 30 fish per angler.

During the open season, aggregate vessel limit may not exceed 150 fish.

STRIPED BASS



Open Season: Year Round Size Limit: 28" to less than 31" Possession Limit: 1 fish

Gaffing prohibited. Use of in-line circle hooks is mandatory when fishing with whole or cut natural baits, except with artificial lures.

WEVKEICH



Open Season: Year Round Minimum Size: 16" Possession Limit: 1 fish

WINTER FLOUNDER



Open Season: Year Round South of Cape Cod Mar 1 - Dec 31

Minimum Size: 12" 12"
Possession Limit: 8 fish 2 fish

TAUTOG



 Open Season: April 1 - May 31

During the open season, 1-fish per person per day may exceed 21" & the aggregate vessel limit may not to exceed 10-fish.

BE A WINNER IN THE MVSA IN-HOUSE DERBY

MVSA In-House Derby - This is a fun and loosely run tournament based solely on the honor system and club members are eligible to win prizes by submitting entries for one or more of the eligible species (striped bass, bluefish, false albacore, bonito). Fish can be kept but catch and release is strongly encouraged. To determine the weight, the fish can be weighed or the weight can be estimated by using the following formula. (length x the girth squared, divided by 800=total weight). It's surprisingly accurate.

HOW TO ENTER -----

You must be a paid in full member before catching and weighing in any fish.

Use the weigh-in slip on the MVSA website and make as many copies as you need.

When you catch a fish you want to enter, use the calculation above or weigh on a digital fishing scale.

To be eligible for consideration, your fish must conform to the minimum sizes below:

Bluefish 22" Bonito 21" False Albacore 25"

Boundaries: To be eligible, a fish must be caught in or around the waters of Martha's Vineyard, within MVSB & BF Derby Boundaries. (Fish caught during the trip to Cuttyhunk are not eligible for any prizes)

DIVISION AND AWARDS

A monthly pin will be awarded to the member that submits an entry for the largest fish in each species. All monthly entries will participate in a "luck of the draw" raffle to win a Ron McKee custom lure. All first, second and third place monthly winners will also be entered into a year-end raffle to win new fishing reels. There will be three raffles, one each for all first, second and third place entries.

The 'Angler of the Year' will be determined by a point system based on monthly entries. Five points will be awarded for a first-place monthly winner, three for second, and one for third. The member who finishes the year with the most points will be declared the 'Angler of the Year'.

Entries: Must be received within seven days after the catch and may be submitted by **email** to Dave Balon at: WeighSlip@mvsurfcasters.org. If you do not have an email account, mail your entry to: MVSA In-House Derby, P.O. Box 3053, Edgartown, MA 02539

Slips must be postmarked within seven days of the date of catch. During the MV Bass & Bluefish Derby, there is no need to fill out our weigh-in slip; simply mail in the official MV Derby weigh-in slip.
